897  **COMPOUNDS:**

898  Freon

900  **CORROSIVES:** (Acids/Caustics are corrosives because they will attack skin or metal. Caustics are also called bases or alkalis. Corrosives are found in liquid and dry form.)

901  Acids (sulfuric, nitric, acetic - i.e., ammonia, battery acid, toilet bowl cleaners, etc.)

903  Bases (ammonium hydroxide, caustic soda - i.e., toilet bowl cleaners, boiler additives, ammonia cleaner, general disinfectant, etc.)

902  Anhydrous Ammonia 904  Cryogenics

905  **EXPLOSIVE:** (Explosives are any chemical compound, mixture or device, the primary or common purpose of which it is to function by explosion.)

906  Ammunition 908  Dynamite

907  Blasting caps

910  **FLAMMABLES:** (Solvents are used to dissolve or thin materials like oils, greases, paint and resins. Solvents can be flammable or combustible.)

911  Paint (oil base)

912  Solvents/Thinners (for cleaning, or thinning, acetone, alcohol, petroleum distillates)

925  **OXIDIZERS:** (Oxidizers yield oxygen readily to feed fires. Mixed with other chemicals, oxidizers start/support fires, or cause violent reactions. Oxidizers also burn your skin.)

930  **POISON:** (Term for extremely dangerous gases or liquids. Poisons inhaled, absorbed (through the skin) or eaten in sufficient quantities, result in injury or death.)
